A bill to be entitled

An act relating to Search and Rescue (SAR) dogs; amending s. 843.19, F.S.; defining the term "SAR dog"; prohibiting the injuring or killing of an SAR dog under specified circumstances; providing penalties; revising the offense of inflicting bodily harm upon a police dog, fire dog, or police horse; providing penalties; amending s. 921.0012, F.S., relating to the sentencing guidelines offense levels and offense severity ranking chart; providing for ranking of the new or revised offenses as level 3 offenses; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 843.19, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

843.19 Injuring or killing police dog, or fire dog, SAR dog, or police horse prohibited; penalty.--

(1) As used in this section, the term:

(a) "Police dog" means any dog, and "police horse" means any horse, that which is owned, or the service of which is employed, by a law enforcement agency for the principal purpose of aiding in the detection of criminal activity, enforcement of laws, or apprehension of offenders.

(b) "Fire dog" means any dog $\underline{\text{that}}$ which is owned, or the service of which is employed, by a fire department, $\underline{\text{a}}$ special fire district, or $\underline{\text{the}}$ State Fire Marshal-for the

principal purpose of aiding in the detection of flammable materials or the investigation of fires. 2 3 (c) "SAR dog" means any search and rescue dog that is owned, or the service of which is utilized, by a fire 4 5 department, a law enforcement agency, a special fire district, 6 or the State Fire Marshal for the principal purpose of aiding 7 in the detection of missing persons, including, but not limited to, persons who are lost, who are trapped under debris 8 as the result of a natural, manmade, or technological disaster, or who are drowning victims. 10 (2) Any person who knowingly and willfully and without 11 lawful cause or justification inflicts great bodily harm, 12 13 permanent disability, or death upon a police dog, or fire dog, 14 SAR dog, or police horse commits a felony of the third degree, 15 punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. 16 17 Section 2.
