A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Florida Retirement System; amending s. 121.021, F.S.; including certain correctional probation officers within the Special Risk Class of that system; amending s. 121.0515, F.S.; specifying criteria for inclusion of correctional probation officers in that class; providing for inclusion of probation and parole circuit and deputy circuit administrators in that class; providing a finding of important state interest; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (15) of section 121.021, Florida Statutes, 1996 Supplement, is amended to read:

121.021 Definitions.--The following words and phrases as used in this chapter have the respective meanings set forth unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context:

(15)

(b) Effective October 1, 1978, "special risk member" means a member of the Florida Retirement System who is designated as a special risk member by the division in accordance with s. 121.0515. Such member must be employed as a law enforcement officer, a firefighter, or a correctional officer and must meet certain other special criteria as set forth in s. 121.0515. Effective January 1, 1998, the term "special risk member" also includes any member who is employed

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as a correctional probation officer and meets the special criteria set forth in s. 121.0515(2)(d).

Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 121.0515, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

121.0515 Special risk membership; criteria; designation and removal of classification; credits for past service and prior service; retention of special risk normal retirement date.--

- (2) CRITERIA.--A member, to be designated as a special risk member, must meet the following criteria:
- (a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;
- (b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of the employer or agency of state government. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene

fighting of fires or direct supervision of firefighting units, or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; or

- (c) The member must be employed as a correctional officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; however, superintendents and assistant superintendents shall participate in the Special Risk Class; or—
- (d) The member must be employed as a correctional probation officer and be certified, or must be required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, and counseling of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or community controllees within institutions or the community; or the member must be the supervisor of a member or members who have such responsibilities; however, administrative support

1 personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary 2 duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, 3 legal, and personnel, are not included; except that probation 4 and parole circuit and deputy circuit administrators are 5 included in the Special Risk Class. 6 Section 3. The Legislature finds that a proper and 7 legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees 8 of the state and of its political subdivisions, and the 9 dependents, survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and 10 retirees, are extended the basic protections afforded by governmental retirement systems that provide fair and adequate 11 12 benefits and that are managed, administered, and funded in an 13 actuarially sound manner, as required by Section 14 of Article X of the State Constitution and part VII of chapter 112, 14 15 Florida Statutes. Therefore, the Legislature determines and 16 declares that the provisions of this act fulfill an important 17 state interest. 18 Section 4.
