Such license, permit, 9 10 or authorization shall authorize the person to whom it is issued to take game, freshwater fish, or fur-bearing animals 11 12 in accordance with law and commission rules. Such license, 13 permit, or authorization is not transferable. Each license or 14 permit must bear on its face in indelible ink the name of the 15 person to whom it is issued and other information requested by the commission. Such license, permit, or authorization issued 16 17 by the commission or any agent must be in the personal possession of the person to whom issued while taking game, 18 freshwater fish, or fur-bearing animals. The failure of such 19 person to exhibit such license, permit, or authorization to 20 the commission or its wildlife officers, when such person is 21 22 found taking game, freshwater fish, or fur-bearing animals, is a violation of law. A positive form of identification is 23 24 required when using an authorization, a lifetime license, a 25 5-year license, or when otherwise required by the license or permit. The lifetime licenses and 5-year licenses provided 26 herein shall be embossed with the name, date of birth, the 27 date of issuance, and other pertinent information as deemed 28 29 necessary by the commission. A certified copy of the 30 applicant's birth certificate shall accompany all applications 31 for a lifetime license for residents 12 years of age and

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1 younger.

2 (4) In addition to any license required by this
3 chapter, the following permits and fees for certain hunting,
4 fishing, and recreational uses, and the activities authorized
5 thereby, are:

(b)1. Management area permits to hunt, fish, or б 7 otherwise use for outdoor recreational purposes, land owned, leased, or managed by the commission or the State of Florida 8 9 for the use and benefit of the commission, up to \$25 annually. Permits, and fees thereof, for short-term use of land which is 10 owned, leased, or managed by the commission may be established 11 12 by rule of the commission for any activity on such lands. 13 Such permits and fees may be in lieu of or in addition to the annual management area permit. Other than for hunting or 14 15 fishing, the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply on any lands not owned by the commission, unless the commission 16 17 shall have obtained the written consent of the owner or primary custodian of such lands. 18

19 2. A recreational user permit fee to hunt, fish, or otherwise use for outdoor recreational purposes, land leased 20 by the commission from private nongovernmental owners, except 21 for those lands located directly north of the Apalachicola 22 National Forest, east of the Ochlockonee River until the point 23 24 the river meets the dam forming Lake Talquin, and south of the closest federal highway. The fee for this permit shall be 25 based upon economic compensation desired by the landowner, 26 game population levels, desired hunter density, and 27 administrative costs. The permit fee shall be set by 28 29 commission rule on a per-acre basis. On property currently in 30 the private landowner payment program, the prior year's landowner payment shall be used to augment the landowner lease 31

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fee so as to decrease the permit fee for the users of that 1 property. The spouse and dependent children of a permittee are 2 exempt from the permit fee when engaged in outdoor 3 4 recreational activities other than hunting in the company of the permittee. Notwithstanding any other provision of this 5 chapter, there are no other exclusions, exceptions, or б 7 exemptions from this permit fee. The landowner lease fee, less an administrative permit fee of up to \$25 per permit, shall be 8 9 remitted to the landowner as provided in the lease agreement 10 for each area. (f) A special use permit for limited entry hunting or 11 12 fishing, where such hunting or fishing is authorized by 13 commission rule, shall be up to \$100 per day but shall not exceed \$250 per week. Notwithstanding any other provision of 14 15 this chapter, there are no exclusions, exceptions, or 16 exemptions from this fee. In addition to the fee, the 17 commission may charge each applicant for a special use permit a nonrefundable application fee of up to \$10. 18 19 (g) The fee for a permanent hunting and fishing license for a resident 64 years of age or older is \$12. 20 21 (7) A resident lifetime sportsman's license authorizes the holder to engage in the following noncommercial 22 23 activities: 24 (a) To take or attempt to take or possess freshwater 25 fish, marine fish, and game, consistent with state and federal regulations and rules of the commission and the Department of 26 27 Environmental Protection in effect at the time of taking. (b) All activities authorized by a management area 28 29 permit, a muzzle-loading gun permit, a turkey permit, an archery permit, a Florida waterfowl permit, a snook permit, 30 31 and a crawfish permit. 4

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(c) All activities for which an additional license, 1 2 permit, or fee may be required to take or attempt to take or 3 possess freshwater fish, marine fish, and game, imposed 4 subsequent to the date of purchase of the resident lifetime 5 sportsman's license.
