Section 1. Section 768.125, Florida Statutes, is

768.125 Liability for injury or damage resulting from intoxication. -- Any A person licensed under chapter 561 who knowingly sells, gives, or furnishes, or otherwise provides alcoholic beverages to a person who is visibly intoxicated of lawful drinking age shall be not thereby become liable for injury or damage caused by or resulting from the intoxication of such person. Any, except that a person who willfully and unlawfully sells, gives, or furnishes, or otherwise provides alcoholic beverages to a person who, through the use of reasonable procedures, should have been known to be is not of lawful drinking age or who knowingly serves a person habitually addicted to the excessive use of any or all alcoholic beverages may become liable for injury or damage caused by or resulting from the intoxication of such minor or person.
