I of 21 the State Constitution, except the information may be 22 23 disclosed under the following circumstances: if requested by 24 a law enforcement agency, to the law enforcement agency; if directed by a court order, to a person identified in the 25 26 order; or if the certification has been canceled. For 27 purposes of this section, the term "address" means a 2.8 residential street address, school address, or work address, 29 as specified on the individual's application to be a program 30 participant in the Address Confidentiality Program for Victims of Domestic Violence. This section is subject to the Open

Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s.

119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2002, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that the addresses, corresponding telephone numbers, and social security numbers of program participants in the Address Confidentiality Program for Victims of Domestic Violence be exempt from public records requirements. Release of this information would significantly threaten the safety and security of program participants. Therefore, the harm that would result from such release outweighs any public benefit that might result therefrom.

Section 3. This act shall take effect on the effective date of House Bill No. 1637, relating to the Address Confidentiality Program for Victims of Domestic Violence, or similar legislation enacted during the 1997 Regular Session of the Legislature.
