I. Summary:

This bill expands those situations in which certain proceedings or activities involving legislators may be continued based on a conflict the legislator has with scheduled committee activity during the interim.

This bill amends section 11.111 of the Florida Statutes.

II. Present Situation:

Currently, any proceeding before a court, municipality, or agency of government of the state shall be continued during session and during any period of required committee work when the representing attorney, party, or witness is a member of the Legislature. The continuance is also available in those situations in which a legislator is scheduled to appear before any municipal government, administrative board or agency. The continuance is not automatic, but must be requested (*Little v. Sullivan*, 173 So.2d 135 (1965)). The continuance may not be granted in cases involving emergency circumstances (*A.B.C. Business Forms Inc. v. Spaet*, 201 So.2d 890 (1967)). The period of continuance is to include 15 days before and after a legislative session, and one day before and after the required committee work. The continuance is not to be charged against any party.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill expands the situations during the interim in which the continuance provided in this statute may be granted. A conflict based on any scheduled committee activity rather than just required committee work can be the basis for a continuance. Technical drafting changes are also made in the bill.
