Subsection (9) of section 414.095, Florida 13 Statutes, is amended, and paragraph (j) is added to subsection 14 (15) of that section, to read: 15 414.095 Determining eligibility for the WAGES 16 17 Program.--(9) APPLICATIONS.--The date of application is the date 18 19 the department or authorized entity receives a signed and 20 dated request to participate in the WAGES Program. The request 21 shall be denied 30 days after the initial application if the 22 applicant fails to respond to scheduled appointments, 23 including appointments with the state agency responsible for administering the child support enforcement program, and does 24 25 not contact the department or authorized entity regarding the 26 application. 27 (a) The beginning date of eligibility for temporary 28 cash assistance is the date on which the application is 29 approved or 30 days after the date of application, whichever 30 is earlier. 31

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(b) The add date for a newborn child is the date of the child's birth. (c) The add date for all other individuals is the date on which the client contacts the department to request that the individual be included in the grant for temporary cash assistance. Medicaid coverage for a recipient of temporary (d) cash assistance begins on the first day of the first month of eligibility for temporary cash assistance. (15) PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS.--(j) The payee of the temporary cash assistance payment is the caretaker relative with whom a minor child resides and who assumes primary responsibility for the child's daily supervision, care, and control, except in cases where a protective payee is established. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. SENATE SUMMARY Specifies the dates on which certain individuals become eligible for temporary cash assistance or Medicaid coverage under the WAGES Program. Provides that the caretaker relative with whom a minor child resides may be the payee of temporary cash assistance under the program.
