LEGISLATIVE SUMMARY Requires licensure of any physician, wherever located, who has primary authority over the care or diagnosis of a patient located in this state. Exempts any nonresident physician who consults with a physician licensed in this state and does not exercise such authority. Provides that any physician who provides, through an ongoing regular arrangement, official authenticated interpretations of radiographic images to any health care practitioner or patient located in this state shall be regarded as exercising such authority and therefore is subject to licensure. licensure.
