An act relating to public notification of
sexual predators; amending s. 775.21, F.S.;
requiring the sheriff to advertise certain
information regarding the release of sexual
predators; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (7) of section 775.21, Florida Statutes, 1996 Supplement, is amended to read:

775.21 The Florida Sexual Predators Act; definitions; legislative findings, purpose, and intent; criteria; designation; registration; community and public notification; immunity; penalties.--

- (7) COMMUNITY AND PUBLIC NOTIFICATION. --
- (a) Law enforcement agencies must inform the community and the public of a sexual predator's presence. Upon notification of the presence of a sexual predator, the sheriff of the county or the chief of police of the municipality where the sexual predator temporarily or permanently resides shall notify the community and the public of the presence of the sexual predator in a manner deemed appropriate by the sheriff or the chief of police. Information provided to the community and the public regarding a sexual predator must include:
 - 1. The name of the sexual predator;
- 2. A description of the sexual predator, including a photograph;
- 3. The sexual predator's current address, including the name of the county or municipality;

- 4. The circumstances of the sexual predator's offense or offenses; and
- 5. The age of the victim of the sexual predator's offense or offenses.

This paragraph does not authorize the release of the name of any victim of the sexual predator.

(b) In addition to any other requirements for community and public notification imposed under this section, the sheriff of each county shall, monthly, place an advertisement listing any convicted felon released from prison in the preceding 30 days, who has been lawfully designated as a sexual predator pursuant to this section, in a newspaper of general circulation in that county. The list shall be placed in the main section of the newspaper and shall disclose the sexual predator's name, date of release, and most recent known local address.

(c)(b) The sheriff or the police chief may coordinate the community and public notification efforts with the department. Statewide notification to the public is authorized, as deemed appropriate by local law enforcement personnel and the department.

(d)(c) The department shall adopt a protocol to assist law enforcement agencies in their efforts to notify the community and the public of the presence of sexual predators. The department, in consultation and cooperation with the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, shall determine the feasibility of requiring sexual predators to have a special designation on any drivers license, identification card, or license tag issued in this state.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1997.

********** HOUSE SUMMARY Requires the sheriff to place a monthly newspaper advertisement which identifies sexual predators released during the previous 30 days, and provides their release dates and most recent local addresses.
