Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: Section 1. Subsections (4) and (8) of section 112.3148, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 112.3148 Reporting and prohibited receipt of gifts by individuals filing full or limited public disclosure of financial interests and by procurement employees .--(4)(a) A reporting individual or procurement employee or any other person on his or her behalf is prohibited from knowingly accepting, directly or indirectly, a gift from a political committee or committee of continuous existence, as defined in s. 106.011, or from a lobbyist who lobbies the reporting individual's or procurement employee's agency, or directly or indirectly on behalf of the partner, firm, employer, or principal of a lobbyist, if he or she knows or reasonably believes that the gift has a value in excess of \$100; however, such a gift may be accepted by such person on behalf of a governmental entity or a charitable organization. If the gift is accepted on behalf of a governmental entity or charitable organization, the person receiving the gift shall

29 not maintain custody of the gift for any period of time beyond 30 that reasonably necessary to arrange for the transfer of 31 custody and ownership of the gift.
