Subsections (1) and (2) of section 489.531, 12 13 Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 489.531 Prohibitions; penalties.--14 15 (1) A person may not: (a) Practice contracting unless the person is 16 17 certified or registered; 18 (b) Use the name or title "electrical contractor" or 19 "alarm system contractor" or words to that effect, or 20 advertise himself or a business organization as available to 21 practice electrical or alarm system contracting, when the 22 person is not then the holder of a valid certification or 23 registration issued pursuant to this part; 24 (c) Present as his own the certificate or registration of another; 25 (d) Use or attempt to use a certificate or 26 registration that has been suspended, revoked, or placed on 27 28 inactive or delinquent status; 29 (e) Employ persons who are not certified or registered 30 to practice contracting; 31

21	(b) A registered electrical contractor may bid on
22	electrical contracts which include alarm systems contracting
23	as a part of the contract, provided that the individual shall
24	subcontract such alarm systems contracting to a properly
25	certified or registered alarm system contractor. However, if
26	the registered electrical contractor is properly certified or
27	registered as an alarm system contractor, the individual is
28	not required to subcontract out the alarm system contracting.
29	Nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to prohibit any
30	registered electrical contractor from designing, installing,
31	or modifying conduits or raceways through which low voltage

alarm wiring or any other type of specialized low voltage wiring shall pass. Section 5. This act shall take effect October 1, 1997. HOUSE SUMMARY Provides similar penalties for unlicensed violations with respect to construction contracting and electrical and alarm system contracting. Provides a third degree felony penalty for unlicensed work valued at more than \$1,000. Provides additional exemptions from regulation with respect to electrical and alarm system contracting for the design, installation, or modification of described raseway or conduit for wiring and for the design, installation or modification of electrical wiring, fixtures, appliances, thermostats, apparatus, raseways. fixtures, appliances, thermostats, apparatus, raseways, or conduit which is 2 inches in diameter or less, not exceeding 77 volts or 10 amps, when the items are not part of, or designed to become part of, an alarm system.
