An act relating to elections; amending s.

106.17, F.S.; prohibiting state agencies from soliciting pledges or authorizing or conducting polls or surveys relating to candidacies for public office; exempting polls or surveys conducted by institutions of higher learning for research purposes; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 106.17, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

106.17 Polls and surveys relating to candidacies $\underline{\underline{\textit{i}}}$ prohibitions.--

(1) Any candidate, political committee, or state or county executive committee of a political party may authorize or conduct a political poll, survey, index, or measurement of any kind relating to candidacy for public office so long as the candidate, political committee, or political party maintains complete jurisdiction over the poll in all its aspects.

(2) A state agency may not solicit any pledge or authorize or conduct any political poll, survey, index, or measurement of any kind for the purpose of evaluating or rating any candidate for public office. For the purpose of this subsection, "state agency" means any official or officer in his or her official capacity, commission, authority, council, committee, department, division, bureau, board, section, or other unit or entity of the executive branch of
