Subsection (2) of section 229.58, Florida 24 25 Statutes, is amended to read: 229.58 District and school advisory councils.--26 27 (2) DUTIES.--Each advisory council shall perform such 28 functions as are prescribed by regulations of the school board; however, no advisory council shall have any of the 29 30 powers and duties now reserved by law to the school board. 31 Each school advisory council shall assist in the preparation

and evaluation of the school improvement plan required pursuant to s. 230.23(16), shall review and approve the 2 3 school's School Environmental Safety Incident Report before its submission to the district school board, and shall provide 4 5 such assistance as the principal may request in preparing the 6 school's annual budget and plan as required by s. 229.555(1). 7 Section 2. Paragraph (c) is added to subsection (2) of 8 section 230.2318, Florida Statutes, to read: 9 230.2318 School resource officer program.--10 (2) SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER CERTIFICATION; DUTIES AND 11 RESPONSIBILITIES. --(c) School resource officers must review and approve 12 the school's School Environmental Safety Incident Report 13 required by s. 232.2565 before its submission to the district 14 school board. 15 Section 3. Section 232.2565, Florida Statutes, is 16 17 created to read: 232.2565 School Safety program requirements; reporting 18 19 requirements. --20 (1) SHORT TITLE. -- This section may be cited as the "Safe Schools Act." 21 (2) LEGISLATIVE INTENT. -- The Legislature recognizes 22 that the maintenance of a safe and orderly learning 23 environment is essential to the education process and the 24 general welfare of the school population. The Legislature also 25 shares the critical concern of parents and teachers over the 26 27 threat of serious disruption of the educational process and the possibility of personal harm to students, school board 28 29 employees, and others. The intent of this section is to 30 specify minimum school safety program requirements, minimum

reporting requirements, and a process of accountability to promote the accurate reporting of serious safety incidents.

- council is required to assist in the development and evaluation of the school improvement plan required by s. 230.23(16), which is designed to achieve the state education goals and student performance standards pursuant to ss. 229.591(3) and 229.592. This plan must include specific strategies for cultivating a school environment that is safe and drug-free and in which each student's health and civil rights are protected. Such school safety program plans shall be taken into consideration by the district school board when distributing to each school any funds appropriated by the Legislature for school safety.
- (4) REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.--To assist schools, districts, and staff at the state level in assessing major need areas and the extent and nature of problems in school safety, the following measures shall be taken to promote the accurate and consistent reporting of serious safety incidents, as defined by rules of the state board:
- (a) The school principal, or his or her designee, must annually compile and submit to the district school board a School Environmental Safety Incident Report that includes all serious safety incidents that occur on school grounds, on school transportation, or off-campus at school-sponsored events when a student is involved, and the corresponding disciplinary referral, according to rules of the state board.
- (b) The district school board shall submit the School Environmental Safety Incident Report of each school in the district to the Department of Education for inclusion in a statewide School Environmental Safety Incident Report.

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30 31 (c) The Department of Education must provide technical assistance and training for district personnel responsible for compiling the School Environmental Safety Incident Report.

- (d) Before its submission to the district school board, the School Environmental Safety Incident Report of the school shall be reviewed and approved by the school advisory council. The School Environmental Safety Incident Report must, in addition, be reviewed and approved by the school resource officer if employed by the district at that school.
- (5) EVALUATION; SANCTIONS. -- The Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability (OPPAGA) is directed to develop a system for periodically reviewing the safety incident reporting procedures of schools and school districts. By January 1, 1999, OPPAGA will review and evaluate current safety incident reporting procedures, evaluate sample School Environmental Safety Incident Report data to determine accuracy, and develop recommended changes to correct any cited deficiencies regarding safety incident reporting procedures. By January 1, 2001, OPPAGA will conduct a followup review to determine whether such recommendations have been implemented and whether the accuracy of School Environmental Safety Incident Report data has improved. The director of OPPAGA may, at his or her discretion, contract with private consultants to perform part or all of the review of any district. Upon the finding of discrepancies or deficiencies regarding the safety incident reporting procedures of a school or school district, the state board is authorized to recommend action to be taken, including mandatory training or other measures, to correct the cited deficiencies, as recommended by the Commissioner of Education.

schools providing a safe and orderly learning environment, school districts shall annually select one elementary school, one middle school, and one high school to be presented a School Safety Award by the Commissioner of Education. Each district school board shall develop criteria for the selection of schools to receive the School Safety Award. An award granted under this subsection may include, but need not be limited to, a certificate, plaque, medal, ribbon, or photograph, as determined by the Commissioner of Education.

Section 4. Paragraphs (a) and (d) of subsection (1) of section 232.26, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

232.26 Authority of principal.--

- (1)(a) Subject to law and to the rules of the state board and the district school board, the principal in charge of the school or the principal's designee shall develop policies for delegating to any teacher or other member of the instructional staff or to any bus driver transporting students of the school responsibility for the control and direction of students, including the reporting of incidents for inclusion in the School Environmental Safety Incident Report required by s. 232.2565. The principal or the principal's designee shall consider the recommendation for discipline made by a teacher, other member of the instructional staff, or a bus driver when making a decision regarding student referral for discipline.
- (d) The principal or the principal's designee shall include an analysis of <u>serious safety incidents occurring on school grounds</u>, on <u>school transportation</u>, or at <u>school-sponsored events</u>, when a student is involved, and the <u>corresponding disciplinary referral action and suspensions and expulsions in the annual report of school progress</u>.

             Creates the Safe Schools Act. Provides for inclusion of safety issues relating to safe, drug-free school environments in which students' health and civil rights
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              are protected in school improvement plans. Requires schools to submit annual School Environmental Safety
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             Incident Reports, which must be reviewed by school advisory councils and school resource officers. Provides for review of reporting procedures by the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Governmental Accountability. Provides for the Commissioner of Education to award school safety awards to one elementary school, one middle school, and one high school in each county.
