Subsection (1) of section 457.102, Florida 20 Statutes, is amended, and subsection (6) is added to that 21 section, to read: 22 457.102 Definitions.--As used in this chapter: 23 "Acupuncture" means a form of primary health care, based on traditional Chinese medical concepts and modern 24 25 Oriental medical techniques, that employs acupuncture diagnosis and treatment, as well as adjunctive therapies and 26 27 diagnostic techniques, for the promotion, maintenance, and 28 restoration of health and the prevention of disease. Acupuncture shall include, but not be limited to, the 29 30 insertion of acupuncture needles and the application of

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31 | moxibustion to specific areas of the human body.

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1 (6) "Oriental medicine" means the use of acupuncture, electro-acupuncture, Qi Gong, oriental massage, herbal 2 3 therapy, dietary guidelines, and other adjunctive therapies. Section 2. Subsection (1) of section 457.103, Florida 4 5 Statutes, is amended to read: 6 457.103 Board of Acupuncture; membership; appointment 7 and terms.--(1) The Board of Acupuncture is created within the 8 9 department and shall consist of seven five members, to be 10 appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate. Five 11 Three members of the board must be licensed Florida acupuncturists. Two members must be laypersons who are not and 12 who have never been acupuncturists or members of any closely 13 related profession. Members shall be appointed for 4-year 14 terms or for the remainder of the unexpired term of a vacancy. 15

- (2) A person may become licensed to practice acupuncture if the person applies to the department and:
 - (a) Is 18 years of age or older;

(b) Has completed 60 college credits from an accredited postsecondary institution as a prerequisite to enrollment in an authorized 3-year course of study in acupuncture and Oriental medicine, and has completed a 3-year course of study in acupuncture and Oriental medicine, and effective July 31, 2001, a 4-year course of study in acupuncture and Oriental medicine, which meets standards established by the board by rule, which standards include, but are not limited to, successful completion of academic courses in western anatomy, western physiology, western pathology, and

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western biomedical terminology, first aid, and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). However, any person who enrolled in an authorized course of study in acupuncture before August 1, 1997, must have completed only a 2-year course of study which meets standards established by the board by rule, which standards must include, but are not limited to, successful completion of academic courses in western anatomy, western physiology, and western pathology;

- (c) Has successfully completed a board-approved national certification process, is actively licensed in a state that has examination requirements that are substantially equivalent to or more stringent than those of this state, or passes an examination administered by the department, which examination tests the applicant's competency and knowledge of the practice of acupuncture. At the request of any applicant, oriental nomenclature for the points shall be used in the examination. The examination shall include a practical examination of the knowledge and skills required to practice acupuncture, covering diagnostic and treatment techniques and procedures; and
- (d) Pays the required fees set by the board by rule not to exceed the following amounts:
- Examination fee: \$500 plus the actual per applicant cost to the department for purchase of the written and practical portions of the examination from a national organization approved by the board.
 - 2. Application fee: \$300.
- Reexamination fee: \$500 plus the actual per applicant cost to the department for purchase of the written and practical portions of the examination from a national 31 organization approved by the board.

1 Initial biennial licensure fee: \$400, if licensed in the first half of the biennium, and \$200, if licensed in 2 3 the second half of the biennium. Section 4. Subsection (3) of section 457.107, Florida 4 5 Statutes, is amended to read: 6 457.107 Renewal of licenses; continuing education. --7 (3) The board shall by rule prescribe continuing 8 education requirements, not to exceed 30 hours biennially, as a condition for renewal of a license. The criteria for such 9 10 programs or courses shall be approved by the board. In order 11 to meet continuing education requirements, prior approval by 12 the board of such programs or courses is required. All 13 education programs that contribute to the advancement, 14 extension, or enhancement of professional skills and knowledge related to the practice of acupuncture, whether conducted by a 15 nonprofit or profitmaking entity, are eligible for approval. 16 17 The continuing professional education requirements must be in acupuncture or Oriental-medicine subjects, including, but not 18 19 limited to, anatomy, biological sciences, adjunctive therapies, sanitation and sterilization, emergency protocols, 20 and diseases. The board shall have the authority to set a fee, 21 not to exceed \$100, for each continuing education provider or 22 program submitted for approval. The licensee shall retain in 23 24 his or her records the certificates of completion of 25 continuing professional education requirements to prove compliance with this subsection. The board may request such 26 27 documentation without cause from applicants who are selected 28 at random. All national and state acupuncture and 29 Oriental-medicine organizations and acupuncture and Oriental-medicine schools are approved to provide continuing 30 31 professional education in accordance with this subsection.

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4	The committee substitute provides a definition for "Oriental medicine" revises continuing education requirements for
5	medicine, revises continuing education requirements for acupuncturists and eliminates the Board of Acupuncture's authority to approve criteria for continuing education programs and courses, specifies professional continuing
6	programs and courses, specifies professional continuing education requirements for acupuncturists, and substantially
7	revises penalties under the acupuncture practice act.
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
