The Working Capital Trust Fund within the 27 Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, SAMAS number 28 762792, which was created pursuant to section 216.272, Florida 29 Statutes, and which is to be terminated pursuant to Section 30 19(f), Article III of the State Constitution on November 4, 2000, is re-created. 31 1

Section 2. All current balances of the Working Capital Trust Fund within the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles are carried forward, and all current sources and uses of the trust fund are continued. Section 3. This act shall take effect November 4, 2000. HOUSE SUMMARY Re-creates the Working Capital Trust Fund within the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, without modification, and carries forward its current balances and continues its current sources and uses.
