I. Summary:

This legislation recreates the Florida Agricultural Exposition Trust Fund without modification. The Florida Agricultural Exposition Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Corrections.

II. Present Situation:

Section 570.071, F.S., creates trust fund and specifies revenue sources. The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and the Department of Corrections are authorized to construct and equip an agricultural exposition center in Palm Beach County. This center, known as "Florida Agricultural Exposition," is to be used as a place to sell Florida Agricultural products; to attract and inform buyers; to conduct short courses and conferences; and to train prisoners of the correctional institutions of the state in agricultural labor and management. The Legislature appropriated \$107,358 for the 1998-1999 fiscal year to the Department of Corrections for this trust fund.

This bill recreates the trust fund without modification.
