I. Summary:

This legislation recreates the Child Support Enforcement Trust Fund without modification. The Child Support Enforcement Trust Fund is administered by the Justice Administration Commission.

II. Present Situation:

The receipts of the Child Support Trust Fund are expended to execute the terms and conditions of the Child Support Enforcement Contract between the 11th Circuit State Attorney and the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services. There are no estimated expenditures for fiscal year 1998-1999.

The primary revenue source of the Child Support Enforcement Trust Fund is federal funds received from the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Service Child Support Enforcement Program Office pursuant to a cost reimbursement contract with the 11th Circuit State Attorney for child support prosecution.

This bill recreates the trust fund without modification.
