I. Summary:

This legislation recreates the State Attorney Rico Trust Fund without modification. The State Attorney Rico Trust Fund is administered by the Justice Administration Commission.

II. Present Situation:

The receipts of the Civil RICO Trust Fund can be used for prosecution, investigation, and enforcement activities as exercised by the state attorneys. The 1998-1999 fiscal year appropriation is \$273,846.

The primary source of revenue for the Civil RICO Trust Fund is a court judgment of forfeiture against a defendant in a RICO proceeding. After all claims are satisfied, 25 percent of the funds are distributed to the appropriate prosecutorial entity, 25 percent to the investigating law enforcement agency, 25 percent to the Substance Abuse Trust Fund of the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services, and 25 percent to the Department of Natural Resources.

This bill recreates the trust fund without modification.
