**I. Summary:**

This legislation recreates the Motor Vehicle Theft Prevention Trust Fund without modification. The Motor Vehicle Theft Prevention Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Legal Affairs.

**II. Present Situation:**

The receipts of the Motor Vehicle Theft Prevention Trust Fund are expended to prevent, combat, and reduce motor vehicle theft through grant monies that are available to law enforcement, prosecution, and private entities for implementation of theft prevention programs. Two-thirds of the funds shall be made available to qualified applicants under the community juvenile justice partnership grant program established pursuant to s. 39.025(8), F.S. The 1998-1999 fiscal year appropriation is \$2,245,755.
