(1) Each person who, as of July 2, 1998, is registered to vote in the State of Florida under the 18 19 provisions of chapter 97, Florida Statutes, is entitled to a 20 distribution of \$25 as set forth in this section. (2) By August 17, 1998, every supervisor of elections 21 22 must provide to the Department of Revenue a certified list of all voters registered in his or her county as of July 2, 1998. 23 24 This list must include each voter's name and the address and must be in compatible electronic format. Distributions shall 25 be sent to qualified persons as soon as practicable, but no 26 later than November 1, 1998. 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to receive a distribution, the department must withhold the 1 2 amount of the delinquency from the rebate of that obligor. The 3 department shall notify the obligor that his or her rebate is 4 being withheld under this section for the purpose of paying the obligor's delinquent child-support obligations. The 5 6 department shall apply the distribution amount withheld to the 7 delinquent child-support obligation and transmit the balance, 8 if any to the delinquent obligor. (4) The department shall offset any distribution 9 10 pursuant to section 213.25, Florida Statutes, and any other 11 applicable law regarding debts or obligations owed to the 12 state. 13 (5) Under procedures established by the department, 14 each recipient of the distribution described in this section 15 may elect to return the distribution and designate the application of the \$25 to the state for one of the following 16 17 uses: 18 (a) Education; 19 (b) Children's health care; 20 (c) Criminal justice; or 21 (d) Transportation. 22 Section 2. The sum of \$184 million is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Revenue for 23 24 fiscal year 1998-1999 for distribution to eligible registered 25 voters. In the event these funds are insufficient to carry out the provisions of this act, the Administration Commission is 26 27 authorized to transfer sufficient funds from the Working 28 Capital Fund. 29 Section 3. The sum of \$1.8 million is appropriated 30 from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Revenue for 31 fiscal year 1998-1999 to administer the distributions provided 2 File original & 9 copies 04/30/98

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for in this act. The department may contract with private 1 vendors to carry out the distributions, notwithstanding the 2 3 requirements set out in chapter 287, Florida Statutes. The 4 provisions of chapter 120, Florida Statutes, do not apply to 5 this act. Section 4. Any action to challenge the validity or б 7 constitutionality of the rebate provided for in this act must 8 be brought within 60 days after the effective date of this act, or else the challenge is barred. If any such proceeding 9 10 is initiated, distribution of the rebate amounts under this 11 act shall be held in abeyance until a judicial determination 12 has become final and the time limit for any further proceeding regarding the validity or constitutionality of this act has 13 14 expired. 15 Section 5. This act shall take effect upon becoming a 16 law. 17 18 19 20 And the title is amended as follows: 21 remove from the title of the bill: the entire title 22 23 and insert in lieu thereof: 24 A bill to be entitled 25 An act relating to registered voters; providing for a distribution of money to specified 26 27 persons who are registered to vote; providing appropriations; providing a time limit within 28 which challenges to the rebate must be brought; 29 30 providing an effective date. 31

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
