The Legislature further 25 recognizes that the corporation authorized by chapter 946 to 26 manage correctional work programs can provide expertise and assistance in the areas of on-the-job training and employment 27 28 assistance. Partnerships between the state and the corporation 29 authorized by chapter 946 to manage correctional work programs 30 may result in increased employment opportunities for local citizens. 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in economic development initiatives that specifically enhance 1 2 the employment opportunities for WAGES participants, the PRIDE 3 Job Placement Incentive Program is created. The Legislature 4 hereby permits the corporation authorized by chapter 946 to participate in the PRIDE Job Training Placement Incentive 5 Program. б 7 (2) The PRIDE Job Placement Incentive Program is 8 created to encourage the use of the corporation's expertise and resources, including correctional facilities, in job 9 10 training and employment assistance in the economic development 11 of the state. The program shall be administered by the 12 Workforce Development Board of Enterprise Florida, Inc. The 13 Workforce Development Board shall adopt guidelines for the administration of this program. Awarding of grants is 14 15 dependent upon legislative appropriation. 16 (a) The Workforce Development Board may authorize a 17 grant of \$1,000 to the corporation authorized by chapter 946, 18 or a business working in association with such corporation, for full-time employment of a WAGES participant in those 19 workforce development regions and two sites identified by the 20 Workforce Development Board pursuant to subsection (3). The 21 incentive payment shall be paid incrementally, with a payment 22 of \$250 upon initial employment, \$250 at an employment 23 24 duration of 6 months, and \$500 at an employment duration of 1 year. Such grants are provided to off-set the costs of 25 business location and training the local workforce. 26 27 (b) The Workforce Development Board may authorize a grant of \$2,400 to the corporation authorized by chapter 946, 28 29 or a business working in association with such corporation for 30 full-time employment of a WAGES participant and when the 31 corporation provides on-the-job training to the WAGES 2

2	(c) Grants may not be issued for the employment of
3	individuals who have participated in a prison rehabilitative
4	industry program longer that 6 months in the 2 years prior to
5	employment.
6	(d) WAGES participants eligible for employment in the
7	PRIDE Job Placement Incentive Program must be referred by
8	local WAGES coalitions to the corporation authorized by
9	chapter 946.
10	(3) The Workforce Development Board shall identify
11	five workforce development regions in the state which have the
12	least employment opportunities per WAGES participant and, if
13	approved by the Workforce Development Board, two sites where
14	the corporation authorized by chapter 946 has facilities or
15	resources. The five workforce development regions and two
16	sites, if applicable, designated by the Workforce Development
17	Board as having the fewest employment opportunities per WAGES
18	participant are those in which the corporation authorized by
19	chapter 946 or businesses working in association with such
20	corporation may be eligible for job placement incentives.
21	(4) Businesses that have accepted a job placement
22	incentive pursuant to this section may also be eligible to
23	apply for any tax credits, wage supplementation, wage subsidy,
24	or employer payment for that employee which are authorized in
25	law or by agreement with the employer.
26	(5) If approved by the Department of Corrections,
27	WAGES participants may be employed by the corporation
28	authorized by chapter 946 in those facilities not operated
29	within the secured perimeters of the prison grounds that are
30	managed by such corporation, and in other areas, as approved
31	by the Department of Corrections. A safety plan for all WAGES
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participants in this program must be completed by the corporation in cooperation with the Department of Corrections. (6) In carrying out the provisions of this section, the corporation shall be entitled to all the privileges and immunities as set forth in part II of chapter 946.
