I. Summary:

This local bill authorizes the Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to issue an alcoholic beverage vendor license to the La Sociedad La Union Marti-Maceo to allow sales of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises.

II. Present Situation:

Chapter 63-1412, Laws of Florida, creates a special club license in Hillsborough County that allows the licensee to serve and distribute alcoholic beverages to resident guests as well as to members and nonresident guests. This special club license was available only to clubs operating under s. 561.34(11), F.S., as of October 1, 1963. It is not transferable and may not be moved to another location. La Sociedad La Union Marti-Maceo, Inc. (La Sociedad) does not hold a special club license or any other type of alcoholic beverage license in Hillsborough County.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

Section 1. The bill authorizes the division to issue an alcoholic beverage license to La Sociedad. It states the organization's address and provides that La Sociedad shall pay the applicable license fee and that such license is not transferable.

Section 2. The bill provides that alcoholic beverages sold under pursuant to this license must for consumption on the premises and prohibits the sale of alcoholic beverages in sealed containers for consumption off the premises. The license issued is not a special club license, it does not restrict La Sociedad's sales to residents or members, and it allows for sales for consumption on the premises.

Section 3 provides an effective date upon becoming law.
