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               STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 302
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     This committee substitute deletes the requirement that the appropriate local government and regional poison control center enter cooperative agreements under which a protocol is
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     established where the poison control center is consulted via a telephone conference call for each call to the "911" system
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     that involves exposure to a toxic substance. The replacement
     language requires regional poison control centers and life support service licensees to develop and implement,
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    respectively, a prehospital emergency dispatch protocol that defines toxic substances and describes the procedure by which the designated regional poison control center may be consulted by the life support service licensee.
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
