1 A bill to be entitled 2 An act for the relief of Freddie Lee Pitts and 3 Wilbert Lee; providing for a hearing to be 4 conducted by the Division of Administrative 5 Hearings; requiring the Department of Legal 6 Affairs to represent the state; providing a 7 contingent appropriation to compensate Freddie Lee Pitts and Wilbert Lee, if appropriate; 8 9 providing a contingent appropriation for the 10 payment of attorneys' fees; providing an effective date. 11 12 WHEREAS, in 1972 Freddie Lee Pitts and Wilbert Lee were 13 14 convicted of first degree murder in the deaths of Grover Floyd 15 and Jesse Burkett, and WHEREAS, in 1975 Freddie Lee Pitts and Wilbert Lee were 16 17 granted a full pardon for their convictions, and 18 WHEREAS, beginning in 1977 numerous relief bills have 19 been filed on behalf of Freddie Lee Pitts and Wilbert Lee, and 20 WHEREAS, in 1979, 1989, and 1990 the Florida House of 21 Representatives conducted hearings on relief bills for Freddie Lee Pitts and Wilbert Lee, but resolution of the issues 22 23 relating to the fundamental fairness of the criminal proceedings which resulted in the claimant's convictions, and 24 their entitlement to equitable relief, was not concluded, and 25 26 WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature seeks to provide an 27 impartial forum for the resolution of these issues, NOW, 28 THEREFORE, 29 30 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 31 1

Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Maurice Rosen 1 2 Act." 3 Section 2. The Division of Administrative Hearings is 4 directed to appoint an administrative law judge to conduct a 5 hearing and determine whether a basis for equitable relief 6 exists for the purpose of compensating claimants Freddie Lee 7 Pitts and Wilbert Lee for any wrongful act or omission of the 8 State of Florida, or officials thereof, which affected the 9 fundamental fairness of the criminal proceedings against the claimants and resulted in their convictions. In conducting the 10 hearing, the administrative law judge shall review the trial 11 12 and appellate record of the criminal cases against the 13 claimants, the record of the legislative proceedings, and the 14 Cabinet pardon proceedings and shall report on the fundamental 15 fairness thereof. The Department of Legal Affairs is directed to provide representation for the State of Florida. 16 17 Section 3. If the administrative law judge determines by a preponderance of the evidence that the State of Florida, 18 19 or officials, thereof, committed a wrongful act and that a 20 basis for equitable relief exists, the administrative law judge is authorized to award claimants Freddie Lee Pitts and 21 Wilbert Lee the amount of \$500,000 each. The determination of 22 23 the administrative law judge shall be reported to the President of the Florida Senate and the Speaker of the Florida 24 House of Representatives no later than July 1, 1998. The 25 26 Comptroller is authorized to draw a warrant in satisfaction of 27 the relief awarded by the administrative law judge as provided in this act, and the State Treasurer is directed to pay the 28 29 same out of funds appropriated in section 4 of this act. Section 4. The amount of \$1,250,000 is hereby 30 appropriated from the General Revenue Fund in the State 31

Treasury to fund any amounts awarded to Freddie Lee Pitts and Wilbert Lee pursuant to this act, including amounts awarded pursuant to section 5 of this act. Section 5. In addition to any funds awarded to claimants, if the claimants are determined to be prevailing parties, the administrative law judge is authorized to award a reasonable attorney's fee including all costs to the claimants in an amount not to exceed 25 percent of the compensation awarded. Section 6. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
