recommended name of the new state veterans' nursing home, and 1 2 WHEREAS, First Lieutenant Baldomero Lopez, U.S. Marine 3 Corps, grew up in Tampa, Florida, and graduated from 4 Hillsborough High School, and WHEREAS, after graduation, Baldomero Lopez entered the 5 6 U.S. Navy and was selected for an appointment at the U.S. 7 Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland, where he graduated in the upper third of his class, and was commissioned in the U.S. 8 9 Marine Corps, and 10 WHEREAS, First Lieutenant Baldomero Lopez was awarded 11 the Congressional Medal of Honor for his heroic deeds on 12 September 15, 1950, the day on which he gave his life for his 13 country, and 14 WHEREAS, in action against enemy aggressor forces 15 during the Inchon Invasion in Korea on September 15, 1950, First Lieutenant Lopez was leading his platoon against enemy 16 17 beach defenses, and WHEREAS, exposing himself to hostile fire, he moved 18 forward alongside a bunker and prepared to throw a hand 19 20 grenade into the next pillbox, whose fire was pinning down his 21 sector of the beach, and 22 WHEREAS, taken under fire by an enemy automatic weapon and hit in the right shoulder and chest as he lifted his arm 23 24 to throw the grenade, he fell backward and dropped the deadly 25 missile, and WHEREAS, after a moment, he turned and dragged his body 26 27 forward in an effort to retrieve the grenade and throw it, and WHEREAS, in critical condition from pain and loss of 28 29 blood, and unable to grasp the hand grenade firmly enough to 30 hurl it, he chose to sacrifice himself, rather than endanger 31 the lives of his men, and with a sweeping motion of his
