The cost of vaccination must be borne by the animal's owner. 16 17 (2) A dog, or cat, or ferret is exempt from 18 vaccination against rabies if a licensed veterinarian has 19 examined the animal and has certified in writing that at the time vaccination would endanger the animal's health because of 20 its age, infirmity, disability, illness, or other medical 21 considerations. An exempt animal must be vaccinated against 22 23 rabies as soon as its health permits. (d) 3 The species, age, sex, color, breed, weight, and (e) 4 name of the animal vaccinated. 5 (f) The rabies vaccine manufacturer. 6 The vaccine lot number and expiration date. (g) 7 The type and brand of vaccine used. (h) 8 (i) The route of administration of the vaccine. 9 (j) The signature or signature stamp of the licensed veterinarian. 10 11 (4) Beginning March 1, 1999, each ferret vaccinated 12 according to this section must be quarantined, when necessary, according to rules of the Department of Health. 13 14 (5) (4) Violation of this section is a civil 15 infraction, punishable as provided in s. 828.27(2). 16 (6) (5) This section does not prohibit or limit 17 municipalities or counties from enacting requirements similar 18 to or more stringent than the provisions of this section for 19 the implementation and enforcement of rabies-control 20 ordinances. 21 Section 2.
