Section 775.085, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 15 16 775.085 Evidencing prejudice while committing offense; 17 reclassification enhanced penalties .--18 (1)(a) The penalty for Any felony or misdemeanor shall 19 be reclassified to the next higher degree as provided in this subsection if the commission of such felony or misdemeanor 20 21 evidences prejudice based on the race, color, ancestry, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, or national origin, 22 mental or physical disability, or advanced age of the victim: 23  $1.\frac{(a)}{(a)}$  In the case of a misdemeanor of the second 24 25 degree, the offense is reclassified to shall be punishable as 26 if it were a misdemeanor of the first degree. 2.(b) In the case of a misdemeanor of the first 27 28 degree, the offense is reclassified to shall be punishable as 29 if it were a felony of the third degree. 30 31

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3.(c) In the case of a felony of the third degree, the offense is reclassified to shall be punishable as if it were a felony of the second degree.

4.(d) In the case of a felony of the second degree, the offense is reclassified to shall be punishable as if it were a felony of the first degree.

- (b) As used in paragraph (a), the term:
- 1. "Mental or physical disability" means that the victim suffers from a condition of physical or mental incapacitation due to a developmental disability, organic brain damage, or mental illness, and has one or more physical or mental limitations that restrict the victim's ability to perform the normal activities of daily living.
- $\underline{\text{2. "Advanced age" means that the victim is older than}}$  65 years of age.
- (2) A person or organization that which establishes by clear and convincing evidence that it has been coerced, intimidated, or threatened in violation of this section has shall have a civil cause of action for treble damages, an injunction, or any other appropriate relief in law or in equity against that natural person. Upon prevailing in such civil action, the plaintiff may recover reasonable attorney's fees and costs against that natural person.
- (3) It  $\underline{is}$  shall be an essential element of this section that the record reflect that the defendant perceived, knew, or had reasonable grounds to know or perceive that the victim was within the class delineated in this section  $\frac{1}{1}$
- (4) Those acts prohibited under chapters 395 and 400 shall not be construed as an offense evidencing prejudice based on the mental or physical disability or advanced age of the victim.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 1998.
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
