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(b) Has attained at least the score identified by rules of the Department of Education on the combined verbal and quantitative parts of the Scholastic Aptitude Test, the Scholastic Assessment Test, or the recentered Scholastic Assessment Test of the College Entrance Examination, or an equivalent score on the American College Testing Program; or (c) Has attended a home education program according to s. 232.02(4) during grades 11 and 12, and has attained at least the score identified by rules of the Department of Education on the combined verbal and quantitative parts of the Scholastic Aptitude Test, the Scholastic Assessment Test, or the recentered Scholastic Assessment Test of the College Entrance Examination, or an equivalent score on the American College Testing Program; or (d) Has been awarded an International Baccalaureate Diploma from the International Baccalaureate Office; or (e) Has been recognized by the merit or achievement programs of the National Merit Scholarship Corporation as a scholar or finalist. Effective with the 1998-1999 school year, a student must complete a program of community service work, as approved by the district school board or the administrators of a nonpublic school, which shall include a minimum of 75 hours of service work and require the student to identify a social problem that interests him or her, develop a plan for his or her personal involvement in addressing the problem, and, through papers or other presentations, evaluate and reflect upon his or her

A Florida Gold Seal Scholar who has a cumulative 8 grade point average of $3.0 \frac{2.75}{2.75}$ in all postsecondary education 9 work attempted and meets the testing requirement for the Florida Merit Scholars award specified in s. 240.40206(1)(b) 10 may apply for a Florida Merit Scholars award at any renewal 11 12 period. All other provisions of that program apply, and the 13 credit-hour limitation must be calculated by subtracting from the student's total eligibility the number of credit hours the 14 15 student attempted while earning the Gold Seal Vocational 16 Scholarship. 17 Section 4.
