contents, therapeutic values, and uses of any medicinal drug:

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    such prescriptions or orders; and other pharmaceutical
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    services. For purposes of this subsection, "other
    pharmaceutical services" means the evaluation and monitoring
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    of the patient's health as it relates to drug therapy and
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    assisting the patient in the management of his or her drug
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    therapy, and includes the assessment of the patient's drug
    therapy and communication with the patient and the patient's
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    prescribing health care provider as licensed under chapter
    458, chapter 459, chapter 461, or chapter 466, or similar
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    statutory provision in another jurisdiction, or such
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    provider's agent or such other persons as specifically
    authorized by the patient, regarding the drug therapy.
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   Practice of the profession of pharmacy"<del>The phrase</del> also
    includes any other act, service, operation, research, or
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    transaction incidental to, or forming a part of, any of the
    foregoing acts, requiring, involving, or employing the science
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    or art of any branch of the pharmaceutical profession, study,
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    or training, and shall expressly permit a pharmacist to
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    transmit information from persons authorized to prescribe
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    medicinal drugs to their patients. In addition to the
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    authority to order and dispense medicinal drugs independently
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    of an established protocol as set forth in s. 465.186, a
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    pharmacist may also administer immunizations within the
    framework of an established protocol under a supervisory
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    practitioner who is a physician licensed under chapter 458 or
    chapter 459 or by written agreement with a county health
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    department. The decision by a supervisory practitioner to
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    enter into such a protocol is a professional decision of the
    practitioner, and no person may interfere with a supervisory
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practitioner's decision as to whether to enter into such a
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   protocol. A pharmacist may not enter into a protocol that is
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   to be performed while acting as an employee without the
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   written approval of the owner of the pharmacy.
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           Section 2. Paragraph (1) of subsection (1) of section
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    465.016, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
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           465.016 Disciplinary actions.--
           (1) The following acts shall be grounds for
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   disciplinary action set forth in this section:
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           (1) Placing in the stock of any pharmacy any part of
   any prescription compounded or dispensed which is returned by
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   a patient; however, in a hospital, nursing home, correctional
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   facility, or extended care facility in which unit-dose
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   medication is dispensed to inpatients, each dose being
   individually sealed and the individual unit dose or unit-dose
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   system labeled with the name of the drug, dosage strength,
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   manufacturer's control number, and expiration date, if any,
   the unused unit dose of medication may be returned to the
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   pharmacy for redispensing. Each pharmacist shall maintain
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   appropriate records for any unused or returned medicinal
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   drugs.
