For the purpose of 16 17 recognizing and rewarding outstanding performance and academic 18 achievement on the part of public school students, the 19 Commissioner of Education may annually award a full scholarship to any state community college, a scholarship for 20 tuition and materials to any state university, or a 21 scholarship to an independent college or university accredited 22 23 by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools at the value of the average tuition and 24 fees in the State University System to any such student who 25 26 meets the following criteria: 27 (a) Graduates from high school by the end of the 28 eleventh grade. 29 Graduates with a 3.2 grade point average, on a 4.0 30 scale, in courses that meet the entrance requirements to state universities.

- outstanding performance and academic achievement on the part of public high schools pursuant to any incentive funding provided in the annual General Appropriations Act for remediation reduction or similar postsecondary preparedness incentive funding, the distribution formula shall increase the per student incentive funding provided to those high schools that graduate students who meet the criteria in subsection (1). Each student who meets the criteria in subsection (1) shall generate double the normal per student incentive funding amount for the high school he or she attends.
- (3) Any student who meets the requirements for the Florida Academic Scholars' Certificate Program or any Florida merit scholarship award authorized by law shall receive all recognition and rewards of such program or award.
- (4) In order to share innovative practices regarding the incentive program for early high school graduation, each school district that receives incentive funding pursuant to this section shall provide to the Department of Education:
- (a) A description of the changes made in curriculum offerings in middle school that allow selected students to take high school courses for credit.
- (b) A description of the changes made in curriculum offerings in high school that allow selected students to progress at a faster rate and graduate by the end of the eleventh grade.
- (c) A description of other changes made in the school district that allow and encourage students to progress through school at a faster rate.

(5) The Department of Education may adopt rules necessary for the implementation and administration of this section. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
