I. SUMMARY:

This bill designates Gratigny Parkway (State Road 924) in Dade County as the "Marlins Expressway"; and directs the Department of Transportation to erect suitable markers.

The bill also designates the Children's Medical Services Building to be built in Jacksonville as the "Richard G. Skinner, Jr., M.D., Children's Medical Services Building"; and directs the Department of Health to erect suitable markers.

The road designation in the bill has a negative fiscal impact of \$900 to the State Transportation Trust Fund; there is little or no fiscal impact to the Department of Health for the building designation.

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II. SUBSTANTIVE RESEARCH:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

The Gratigny Parkway, or State Road 924 in Dade County has no previous designations by the Legislature.

The Children's Medical Services Building is to be constructed in Jacksonville; and has no previous designations by the Legislature.

This bill designates Gratigny Parkway (State Road 924) in Dade County as the "Marlins Expressway"; and directs the Department of Transportation to erect suitable markers.

The bill also designates the Children's Medical Services Building to be built in Jacksonville as the "Richard G. Skinner, Jr., M.D., Children's Medical Services Building"; and directs the Department of Health to erect suitable markers.
