17	Section 1. Section 236.08106, Florida Statutes, is

19	236.08106 Excellent Teaching Program
20	(1) The Legislature recognizes that teachers play a
21	critical role in preparing students to achieve the high levels
22	of academic performance expected by the Sunshine State
23	Standards. The Legislature further recognizes the importance
24	of identifying and rewarding teaching excellence and of
25	encouraging good teachers to become excellent teachers. The
26	Legislature finds that the National Board of Professional
27	Teaching Standards (NBPTS) has established high and rigorous
28	standards for accomplished teaching and has developed a
29	national voluntary system for assessing and certifying
30	teachers who demonstrate teaching excellence by meeting those
31	standards. It is therefore the Legislature's intent to provide
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incentives for teachers to seek NBPTS certification and to 1 2 reward teachers who demonstrate teaching excellence by attaining NBPTS certification and sharing their expertise with 3 4 other teachers. 5 (2) The Excellent Teaching Program is created to 6 provide categorical funding for monetary incentives and 7 bonuses for teaching excellence. The Department of Education shall allocate and distribute to each school district an 8 amount as prescribed annually by the Legislature for the 9 10 Excellent Teaching Program. Unless otherwise provided in the General Appropriations Act, each school district's annual 11 12 allocation shall be the sum of the amounts earned for the 13 following incentives and bonuses: (a) A fee subsidy to be paid by the school district to 14 15 the NBPTS on behalf of each individual who is an employee of 16 the district school board or a public school within that 17 school district, who is certified by the district to have 18 demonstrated satisfactory teaching performance pursuant to s. 231.29 and, beginning in the school fiscal year 1999-2000, to 19 have qualified for the district performance-based pay 20 21 incentive pursuant to s. 230.23, who satisfies the prerequisites for participating in the NBPTS certification 22 program, and who agrees, in writing, to pay 10 percent of the 23 24 NBPTS participation fee and to participate in the NBPTS 25 certification program during the school year for which the fee subsidy is provided. The fee subsidy for each eligible 26 27 participant shall be an amount equal to 90 percent of the fee charged for participating in the NBPTS certification program, 28 but not more than \$1,800 per eligible participant. The fee 29 30 subsidy is a one-time award and may not be duplicated for any individual. 31

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1	(b) A portfolio-preparation incentive of \$150 for each
2	teacher employed by the district school board or a public
3	school within the district who is participating in the NBPTS
4	certification program. The portfolio-preparation incentive is
5	a one-time award paid during the school year for which the
6	NBPTS fee subsidy is provided.
7	(c) An annual bonus equal to 10 percent of the prior
8	fiscal year's statewide average salary for classroom teachers
9	to be paid to each individual who holds NBPTS certification
10	and is employed by the district school board or by a public
11	school within that school district. The district school board
12	shall distribute the annual bonus to each individual who meets
13	the requirements of this paragraph and who is certified
14	annually by the district to have demonstrated satisfactory
15	teaching performance pursuant to s. 231.29 and to have
16	qualified for the performance-based pay incentive pursuant to
17	s. 230.23. The annual bonus may be paid as a single payment or
18	divided into not more than three payments.
19	(d) An annual bonus equal to 10 percent of the prior
20	fiscal year's statewide average salary for classroom teachers
21	to be paid to each individual who meets the requirements of
22	paragraph (c) and agrees, in writing, to provide the
23	equivalent of 12 workdays of mentoring and related services to
24	public school teachers within the district who do not hold
25	NBPTS certification. The district school board shall
26	distribute the annual bonus in a single payment following the
27	completion of all required mentoring and related services for
28	the year. It is not the intent of the Legislature to remove
29	excellent teachers from their assigned classrooms, therefore,
30	credit may not be granted by a school district or public
31	school for mentoring or related services provided during the
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regular school day or during the 196 days of required service 1 2 for the school year. 3 The district shall receive an amount equal to 50 (e) 4 percent of the teacher bonuses provided under paragraph (c) and (d), which shall be used by the district for professional 5 6 development of teachers. The district must give priority to 7 using all funds received pursuant to this paragraph for professional development of teachers employed at schools 8 9 identified as performing at critically low levels. 10 11 A teacher for whom the state pays the certification fee and 12 who does not complete the certification program or does not 13 teach in a public school of this state for a least 1 year 14 after completing the certification program must repay the 15 amount of the certification fee to the state. However, a 16 teacher who completes the certification program but fails to 17 be awarded NBPTS certification is not required to repay the 18 amount of the certification fee if the teacher meets the 1-year teaching requirement. Repayment is not required of a 19 teacher who does not complete the certification program or 20 21 fails to fulfill the teaching requirement because of the teacher's death or disability or because of other extenuating 22 circumstances as determined by the State Board of Education. 23 24 Section 2. Paragraph (a) of subsection (5) of section 25 236.081, Florida Statutes, as amended by chapter 97-380, Laws 26 of Florida, is amended to read: 27 236.081 Funds for operation of schools.--If the annual 28 allocation from the Florida Education Finance Program to each district for operation of schools is not determined in the 29 30 annual appropriations act or the substantive bill implementing 31 the annual appropriations act, it shall be determined as

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follows: 1 2 (5) CATEGORICAL PROGRAMS. -- The Legislature hereby 3 provides for the establishment of selected categorical 4 programs to assist in the development and maintenance of 5 activities giving indirect support to the programs previously 6 funded. These categorical appropriations may be funded as 7 general and transitional categorical programs. It is the intent of the Legislature that no transitional categorical 8 9 program be funded for more than 4 fiscal years from the date 10 of original authorization. Such programs are as follows: (a) General.--11 12 1. Comprehensive school construction and debt service 13 as provided by law. 14 2. Community schools as provided by law. 15 3. Section 231.173, Florida Statutes, is 26 amended to read: 27 231.173 Successful experienced out-of-state teachers 28 and administrators. --29 (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of ss. 231.02, 30 231.15, and 231.17, and 231.172 or any other provision of law 31 or rule to the contrary, a successful, experienced, and 5

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specialization coverages as follows: 1 2 (a) Teachers.--An applicant A teacher appointed to an 3 academic assignment shall be eligible for the academic 4 coverage in an area in which the teacher is assigned to teach in a public school or nonpublic school in this state or in the 5 6 area of the applicant's certification by the National Board of 7 Professional Teaching Standards. Only one renewal may 29 30 be granted during each 5-year validity period of a 31 professional certificate, except that a teacher with national

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certification from the National Board for Professional 1 2 Teaching Standards is deemed to meet state renewal 3 requirements for the life of the teacher's national 4 certificate. However, if the renewal application form is not 5 received by the department or by the employing school district 6 before the expiration of the professional certificate, the 7 application form, application fee, and a late fee must be submitted before July 1 of the year following expiration of 8 9 the certificate in order to renew the professional 10 certificate. The state board shall adopt rules to allow a 1-year extension of the validity period of a professional 11 12 certificate in the event of serious illness, injury, or other 13 extraordinary extenuating circumstances of the applicant. The department shall grant such 1-year extension upon written 14 15 request by the applicant or by the superintendent of the local 16 school district or the governing authority of a developmental 17 research school, state-supported school, or nonpublic school that employs the applicant. 18 19 (3) For the renewal of a professional certificate, the 20 following requirements must be met: 21 (b) In lieu of college course credit or inservice 22 points, the applicant may renew a specialization area by passage of a state board approved subject area test, by 23 24 completion of the national certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards in that 25 specialization area, or by completion of a department approved 26 27 summer work program in a business or industry directly related to an area of specialization listed on the certificate.
