No less than 50 percent of the annual allocation shall be used to purchase items which will be used to provide instruction to students at the level or levels for which the materials are designed. However, up to 50 percent of The annual allocation may be used for the purchase of instructional materials, including library and reference books and nonprint materials, not included on the state-adopted list and for the repair and renovation of textbooks and library books. Notwithstanding the provisions of this subsection, school districts may use 100 percent of that portion of the annual allocation which is designated by the district for the purchase of instructional materials for kindergarten, and 75 percent of that portion of the annual allocation which is designated for the purchase of instructional materials for first grade, to purchase materials not on the state-adopted list.
