HOUSE SUMMARY

Requires the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission to establish standards of instruction and continued employment training for law enforcement officers on the subject of the special needs of elderly persons. Provides that every basic skills course required in order for law enforcement officers to obtain initial certification shall, after January 1, 1999, include a minimum of 16 hours of training in issues relating to elderly persons. Provides that the commission shall by rule require that each officer receive, as part of the 40 hours of required instruction for continued employment or appointment as a law enforcement officer, 4 hours of instruction in the subject of issues relating to elderly persons.
