#### I. <u>SUMMARY</u>:

This bill designates the following roads:

A portion of State Road 528 in Brevard and Orange Counties as the "Kennedy Space Center Highway";

A portion of State Road 267 in Gadsden County as the "Pat Thomas Parkway";

A portion of State Road 71 in Jackson County as the "Pete Peterson Parkway";

A portion of State Road 71 in Port St. Joe as the "Cecil G. Costing, Sr. Boulevard"; and

A portion of the Polk County Parkway as the "James Henry Mills Medal of Honor Parkway."

The bill directs the Department of Transportation to erect suitable markers for these designations.

The bill has a negative fiscal impact of approximately \$4,500 to the State Transportation Trust Fund.

#### II. SUBSTANTIVE RESEARCH:

#### A. PRESENT SITUATION:

The Legislature designates state transportation facilities such as roads and bridges to honor persons, events, or such other things as the Legislature deems appropriate. Unless otherwise specified, designations usually involve erecting signs on the right-of-way at either end of the facility being designated for the traveling public to see. Once a road has been designated, the Department of Transportation (DOT) is generally assigned the responsibility for erecting and maintaining the signs. DOT keeps a list of state transportation facilities that have been officially designated in Florida. The list indicates that over 450 designations have been made.

#### B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill designates the following roads:

- ➤ A portion of State Road 528 in Brevard and Orange Counties as the "Kennedy Space Center Highway."
- ➤ A portion of State Road 267 in Gadsden County as the "Pat Thomas Parkway."
- ➤ A portion of State Road 71 in Jackson County as the "Pete Peterson Parkway."
- ➤ A portion of State Road 71 in Port St. Joe as the "Cecil G. Costing, Sr. Boulevard."
- ➤ A portion of the Polk County Parkway as the "James Henry Mills Medal of Honor Parkway."

The Department of Transportation is directed to erect suitable markers for each designation.
