Commissioner of Education, the goal shall be a ratio of one
full-time equivalent teacher per 15 students. For purposes of
any funding in the General Appropriations Act to meet these
goals, the district shall give priority to critically low
performing schools in the district. Second priority for the
use of any funds designated for meeting these goals shall be
for kindergarten through grade one. Third priority for the
use of any funds designated for meeting these goals shall be
for grades two and three.
    (4) Each school district shall implement the goals set
forth in this section to the extent funds are provided through
