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26	Section 1. Section 253.036, Florida Statutes, is

29	(1) All land management plans described in s.
30	253.034(5) which are prepared for parcels larger than 1,000
31	acres shall contain an analysis of the multiple-use potential

3	the parcel. The lead agency shall prepare the analysis, which

Section 4. Subsection (4) is added to section 589.04, Florida Statutes, to read: 589.04 Duties of division .--(4) The Division of Forestry shall begin immediately an aggressive program to reforest and afforest, with appropriate tree species, lands over which the division has forest resource management responsibility. Section 5. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services from the Incidental Trust Fund for fiscal year 1998-1999, four positions and \$159,461, to carry out the provisions of the bill. In addition, \$2,000,000 is hereby appropriated to the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services from the General Revenue Fund for fiscal year 1998-1999 for reforestation activities authorized in this bill.
