A bill to be entitled  
An act relating to voyeurism; creating s.  
810.14, F.S.; prohibiting a person from  
entering onto real property without  
authorization for the purpose of secretly  
observing the occupant of a building or  
structure; providing a penalty; providing an  
effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 810.14, Florida Statutes, is  
created to read:

810.14 Voyeurism prohibited.--A person may not,  
without being authorized, licensed, or invited, enter onto  
real property for the lewd, lascivious, or indecent purpose of  
secretly observing the occupant of a building or structure  
through a window or other opening. A person who violates this  
section commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as  
provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 1998.

SENATE SUMMARY

Provides that it is a third-degree felony for a person to  
enter onto real property without being authorized,  
licensed, or invited for the purpose of secretly  
observing the occupant of a building or structure.
