Section 810.14, Florida Statutes, is 13 created to read: 14 810.14 Voyeurism prohibited.--A person may not, 15 without being authorized, licensed, or invited, enter onto 16 real property for the lewd, lascivious, or indecent purpose of secretly observing the occupant of a building or structure 17 18 through a window or other opening. A person who violates this 19 section commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as 20 provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. 21 Section 2.
