I. <u>SUMMARY</u>:

This bill changes the date of any runoff election of the Hillsborough County School Board members to be held at the same time as the general election as provided by law.

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II. SUBSTANTIVE RESEARCH:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

Special Act Provisions

The provisions of the special acts governing Hillsborough County School Board member elections provide that the first primary election be held at the same time as the first primary election provided in law. The second primary election is to be held as provided by law. If no candidate for school board of Hillsborough County receives a majority of the votes cast at the first primary election, a runoff election is held at the same time as the second primary. Hillsborough County school board elections are nonpartisan.

General Law Provisions

Section 100.061, F.S., provides that in each year in which a general election is held, a first primary election for nomination of candidates of political parties shall be held on the Tuesday 9 weeks prior to the general election. A second primary election is held in every contest in which a candidate does not receive a majority of the votes for the office for which he/she ran. The second primary election is held on the Tuesday 5 weeks prior to the general election.

The general election is scheduled to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each even-numbered year.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill changes the date of any runoff election of the Hillsborough County School Board members to be held at the same time as the general election as provided by law. The effect of the bill is to move any runoff election from the date of the second primary to the date of the general election.
