I. FINAL ACTION STATUS:

House Bill 4029 was passed by the House Committee on Community Affairs on March 30, 1998. The bill passed the House on April 24, 1998, by a vote of 120 YEAS and 0 NAYS. The bill was received by the Senate on April 28, 1998 and was referred to the Senate Committee on Rules and Calendar. It was withdrawn from the Senate Committee on Rules and Calendar on May 1, 1998, and placed on the Senate Local Calendar. The Senate passed HB 4029 on May 1, 1998, by a vote of 40 YEAS and 0 NAYS. The bill became chapter 98-497, Laws of Florida.

II. SUMMARY:

The bill dissolves the St. Lucie County Port & Airport Authority.

III. SUBSTANTIVE RESEARCH:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

The St. Lucie County Port and Airport Authority, a dependent district, was recreated by chapter 97-377, Laws of Florida. The authority is a continuation of the Fort Pierce Port Airport Authority, chapter 61-2754, Laws of Florida, now known as the St. Lucie County Port and Airport Authority pursuant to chapter 88-515, Laws of Florida. The authority's boundaries is all of St. Lucie County. The governing body of the St. Lucie County Port and Airport Authority is made up of ex officio of the five county commissioners of St. Lucie County and the clerk of the circuit court. Th authority's powers include, but are not limited to: employing an airport director and port director, to make contracts, to sue and be sued, to fix and determine rates, to assess, to levy and collect ad valorem taxes and non-ad valorem, and to issue bonds. The authority is currently operated by county employees under the direction of the county administrator. Under its current charter, there is no dissolution provision.

Section 189.4042(2), Florida Statutes, provides that a merger or dissolution of a dependent special district created by special act of the Legislature may only be effectuated by the Legislature unless otherwise provided by general law.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

The bill dissolves the St. Lucie County Port & Airport Authority.

The bill provides that all Authority property is passed and vested in the Board of County Commissioners of St. Lucie County.

The bill provides that no obligations or contracts are impaired or avoided by the dissolution. Rather, all shall be binding upon St. Lucie County.

Section 2: Provides the transfer and vesting of all the District's properties and rights to the Board of County Commissioners of St. Lucie County.

Section 3: Provides that no obligations or contracts are impaired or avoided by the dissolution; and provides that all obligations and contracts are binding upon St. Lucie County.

<u>Section 4</u>: Provides liberal construction in order that St. Lucie County may effectively carry out the assumption of powers and authority.

<u>Section 5</u>: Provides a severability clause.

<u>Section 6</u>: Provides an effective date of upon becoming a law.
