1 A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Retirement 2 System; amending s. 121.021, F.S.; redefining 4 the term "special risk"; amending s. 121.0515, F.S.; describing certain eligible positions in a state forensic facility to be covered within the Special Risk Class of the Florida Retirement System; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Subsection (15) of section 121.021, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

121.021 Definitions.--The following words and phrases as used in this chapter have the respective meanings set forth unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context:

- (15)(a) Until October 1, 1978, "special risk member" means any officer or employee whose application is approved by the administrator and who receives salary payments for work performed as a peace officer; law enforcement officer; police officer; highway patrol officer; custodial employee at a correctional or detention facility; correctional agency employee whose duties and responsibilities involve direct contact with inmates, but excluding secretarial and clerical employees; firefighter; or an employee in any other job in the field of law enforcement or fire protection if the duties of such person are certified as hazardous by his or her employer.
- (b) Effective October 1, 1978, "special risk member" means a member of the Florida Retirement System who is designated as a special risk member by the division in accordance with s. 121.0515. Such member must be employed as

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a law enforcement officer, a firefighter, or a correctional officer or, effective January 1, 1999, in an approved position in a state forensic facility, and must meet certain other special criteria as set forth in s. 121.0515.

Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 121.0515, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

121.0515 Special risk membership; criteria; designation and removal of classification; credits for past service and prior service; retention of special risk normal retirement date.--

- (2) CRITERIA. -- A member, to be designated as a special risk member, must meet the following criteria:
- (a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;
- (b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of

the employer or agency of state government. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting of fires or direct supervision of firefighting units, or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; or

- (c) The member must be employed as a correctional officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; however, superintendents and assistant superintendents shall participate in the Special Risk Class; or
- (d) The member must be employed in a state forensic facility as defined in s. 916.106, established for the treatment of forensic clients, and his or her primary responsibilities must require the custody, control, and physical restraint of patients in a forensic unit of a state hospital, or the member must be the supervisor of a member or members who have such responsibilities. However, professional

medical personnel and administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, dentists, doctors, nurses, and individuals whose primary responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, clerical support, and personnel, shall not be included. Section 3. This act shall take effect October 1 of the year in which enacted. HOUSE SUMMARY Adds specified positions in a state forensic facility. Defines the term "special risk" for the purposes of the Florida Retirement System. Provides that described eligible positions in a state forensic facility shall be covered as special risk positions in the system. See bill for details.
