Section 1. Section 316.1935, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

316.1935 Fleeing or attempting to elude a law enforcement officer; aggravated fleeing and eluding.-(1) It is unlawful for the operator of any vehicle,

30 31 having knowledge that he or she has been <u>ordered</u> directed to stop such vehicle by a duly authorized law enforcement officer, willfully to refuse or fail to stop the vehicle in

compliance with such <u>order</u> directive or, having stopped in knowing compliance with <u>such order</u> the directive, willfully to flee in an attempt to elude the officer, and a person who violates this subsection shall, upon conviction, be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not to exceed 1 year, or by fine not to exceed \$1,000, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

- (2) Any person who willfully flees or attempts, in the course of unlawfully fleeing or attempting to elude a law enforcement officer in an authorized law enforcement patrol vehicle with agency insignia and other jurisdictional markings prominently displayed on the vehicle with siren and lights activated pursuant to subsection (1), having knowledge of an order to stop by a duly authorized law enforcement officer, causes the law enforcement officer to engage in a high-speed vehicle pursuit commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
