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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to rulemaking authority of the Department of Environmental Protection with respect to phosphogypsum management; requiring the Department of Environmental Protection to adopt rules to ensure that phosphogypsum stack systems are operated to meet critical safety standards by January 1, 1999; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Phosphogypsum Management. -- The Department of Environmental Protection shall adopt rules to ensure that temporary impoundment structures and water conveyance piping systems used in the phosphogypsum industry are designed and maintained to meet critical safety standards by January 1, 1999. The rules must require that any temporary impoundment structure used in a phosphogypsum stack system together with all pumps, piping, ditches, drainage conveyances, water control structures, collection pools, cooling ponds, surge ponds, and any other collection or conveyance system associated with phosphogypsum transport, cooling water, or the return of processed wastewater must be reasonably constructed and operated to avoid catastrophic spills into surface or ground waters. The rules must provide that a phosphogypsum stack system owner maintain a log detailing the owner's operating inspection schedule, results, and any corrective action taken. The rules must require phosphogypsum stack owners to maintain an emergency contingency plan to

demonstrate the ability to mobilize equipment and manpower to respond to emerging situations at phosphogypsum stack systems. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. SENATE SUMMARY Requires the Department of Environmental Protection to adopt rules to ensure that phosphogypsum stack systems are operated to meet critical safety standards by January 1, 1999.
