I. <u>SUMMARY</u>:

The bill dissolves the West Parkland Water Management District.

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II. SUBSTANTIVE RESEARCH:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

The West Parkland Water Management District, an independent district, was created by chapter 75-353, Laws of Florida. The purpose of the district is to facilitate the proper development and water control of the land within the District. The governing board of the District consists of five supervisors. The District's powers include, but are not limited to, the authority to: acquire property, contract, sue, adopt water management and control plans, regulate supply and water level, borrow money and issue bonds and other indebtedness, construct bridges, collect fees and rates, and assess and collect ad valorem taxes.

Section 189.4042(2), Florida Statutes, provides that a merger or dissolution of an independent special district created by special act of the Legislature may only be effectuated by the Legislature unless otherwise provided by general law.

The bill dissolves the West Parkland Water Management District.

Although the District was created, it was never organized because there was no need for it. A neighbor allowed residents in the Ranches to drain onto his property.

The bill abolishes an antiquated District and can be abolished without loss of any public service. Water management practices in the city are covered by a number of special districts and by the City of Parkland through special assessments.
