I. SUMMARY:

This bill authorizes the Iona McGregor Fire Protection and Rescue Service District (District) to provide advanced life support (ALS) to residents of the District, subject to the statutory provisions governing medical telecommunications and transportation.

The Economic Impact Statement indicates that current ad valorem taxes and impact fees will fund the necessary equipment and supplies. This cost to the District of providing ALS service is estimated to be \$136,550 for fiscal year 1997-1998.

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II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

The Iona McGregor Fire District was created by the 1975 Legislature by special act. It is an independent special district providing fire services and basic life support services to its residents. The District is approximately 42 square miles serving a population of approximately 45,000. The District employs 64 persons and answered 3,500 calls last year. The average response time is 3 minutes. The District's current millage is 1.67 of assessed valuation. The District's cap is 1.95 mills of assessed valuation.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill authorizes the Iona McGregor Fire Protection and Rescue Service District (District) to provide advanced life support (ALS) to residents of the District, subject to the statutory provisions governing medical telecommunications and transportation.
