Paragraph (e) of subsection (4) of section 25 372.57, Florida Statutes, is amended, paragraph (f) of said 26 subsection is redesignated as paragraph (g) and amended, and 27 new paragraphs (f) and (h) are added to said subsection, and 28 subsection (7), paragraphs (c) and (d) of subsection (8), and 29 subsections (9), (11), and (14) of said section are amended, 30 to read: 31

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1 372.57 Licenses and permits; exemptions; fees.--No 2 person, except as provided herein, shall take game, freshwater 3 fish, or fur-bearing animals within this state without having first obtained a license, permit, or authorization and paid 4 5 the fees hereinafter set forth, unless such license is issued without fee as provided in s. 372.561. Such license, permit, 6 7 or authorization shall authorize the person to whom it is 8 issued to take game, freshwater fish, or fur-bearing animals in accordance with law and commission rules. Such license, 9 permit, or authorization is not transferable. Each license or 10 11 permit must bear on its face in indelible ink the name of the person to whom it is issued and other information requested by 12 13 the commission. Such license, permit, or authorization issued 14 by the commission or any agent must be in the personal 15 possession of the person to whom issued while taking game, 16 freshwater fish, or fur-bearing animals. The failure of such person to exhibit such license, permit, or authorization to 17 the commission or its wildlife officers, when such person is 18 found taking game, freshwater fish, or fur-bearing animals, is 19 20 a violation of law. A positive form of identification is 21 required when using an authorization, a lifetime license, a 22 5-year license, or when otherwise required by the license or permit. The lifetime licenses and 5-year licenses provided 23 herein shall be embossed with the name, date of birth, the 24 date of issuance, and other pertinent information as deemed 25 26 necessary by the commission. A certified copy of the 27 applicant's birth certificate shall accompany all applications 28 for a lifetime license for residents 12 years of age and 29 younger. (4) In addition to any license required by this 30 chapter, the following permits and fees for certain hunting, 31

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1 fishing, and recreational uses, and the activities authorized 2 thereby, are: 3 (e) A Florida turkey permit for a resident to take 4 wild turkeys within this state is \$5. 5 (f) A Florida turkey permit for a nonresident to take б wild turkeys within this state shall be \$100. 7 (g)(f) A special use permit for limited entry hunting 8 or fishing, where such hunting or fishing is authorized by commission rule, shall be up to \$100 per day but shall not 9 exceed \$250 per week. Notwithstanding any other provision of 10 11 this chapter, there are no exclusions, exceptions, or 12 exemptions from this fee. In addition to the fee, the 13 commission may charge each applicant for a special use permit a nonrefundable application fee of up to \$10. 14 15 (h) The fee for a permanent hunting and fishing 16 license for a resident 64 years of age or older is \$12. 17 (7) A resident lifetime sportsman's license authorizes 18 the holder to engage in the following noncommercial 19 activities: 20 (a) To take or attempt to take or possess freshwater fish, marine fish, and game, consistent with state and federal 21 regulations and rules of the commission and the Department of 22 Environmental Protection in effect at the time of taking. 23 24 (b) All activities authorized by a management area permit, a muzzle-loading gun permit, a turkey permit, an 25 26 archery permit, a Florida waterfowl permit, a snook permit, 27 and a crawfish permit. 28 (c) All activities for which an additional license, 29 permit, or fee may be required to take or attempt to take or 30 possess freshwater fish, marine fish, and game, imposed 31 3

1 subsequent to the date of purchase of the resident lifetime 2 sportsman's license. 3 (8) The fee for a resident lifetime sportsman's 4 license is: 5 (c) 13 13-63 years of age or older.....\$1,000 6 (d) 64 years of age or older.....\$12 7 A resident lifetime hunting license authorizes the (9) 8 holder to engage in the following noncommercial activities: (a) To take or attempt to take or possess game 9 10 consistent with state and federal regulations and rules of the commission in effect at the time of taking. 11 12 (b) All activities authorized by a management area 13 permit, excluding fishing, a muzzle-loading gun permit, a 14 turkey permit, an archery permit, and a Florida waterfowl 15 permit. 16 (c) All activities for which an additional license, permit, or fee may be required to take or attempt to take or 17 possess game, imposed subsequent to the date of purchase of 18 the resident lifetime hunting license. 19 20 (11) A resident lifetime freshwater fishing license authorizes the holder to engage in the following noncommercial 21 22 activities: (a) To take or attempt to take or possess freshwater 23 24 fish consistent with state and federal regulations and rules 25 of the commission in effect at the time of taking. 26 (b) All activities authorized by a management area 27 permit, excluding hunting. 28 (c) All activities for which an additional license, 29 permit, or fee may be required to take or attempt to take or possess freshwater fish, imposed subsequent to the date of 30 purchase of the resident lifetime freshwater fishing license. 31 4

(14) The following 5-year licenses are authorized: 1 2 (a) A 5-year freshwater fishing license for a resident 3 to take or attempt to take or possess freshwater fish in this state for 5 consecutive years is \$60 and authorizes the holder 4 to engage in the following noncommercial activities: 1. to take or attempt to take or possess freshwater fish consistent with state and federal regulations and rules of the commission in effect at the time of taking. 2. All activities authorized by a management area 10 permit, excluding hunting. 11 3. All activities for which an additional license, 12 permit, or fee is required to take or attempt to take or 13 possess freshwater fish, imposed subsequent to the date of 14 purchase of the 5-year resident freshwater fishing license 15 until the date of expiration. (b) A 5-year hunting license for a resident to take or 16 attempt to take or possess game in this state for 5 17 consecutive years is $55\frac{270}{2}$ and authorizes the holder to 18 19 engage in the following noncommercial activities: 20 1. to take or attempt to take or possess game consistent with state and federal regulations and rules of the 21 commission in effect at the time of taking. 22 23 2. All activities authorized by a management area permit, excluding fishing, a muzzle-loading gun permit, a 24 25 turkey permit, an archery permit, and a Florida waterfowl 26 permit. 27 3. All activities for which an additional license, 28 permit, or fee may be required to take or attempt to take or 29 possess game, imposed subsequent to the date of purchase of the 5-year resident hunting license until the date of 30

expiration. 31

Paragraph (d) is added to subsection (2) of 2 section 372.672, Florida Statutes, to read: 3 372.672 Florida Panther Research and Management Trust 4 Fund. --5 (2) Money from the fund shall be spent only for the 6 following purposes: 7 (d) To fund and administer education programs 8 authorized in s. 372.674. Section 3. Paragraphs (b), (d), and (e) of subsection 9 10 (6) and subsection (7) of section 372.674, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 11 372.674 Environmental education .--12 13 (6) The advisory council shall: 14 (b) Develop a recommended priority list for projects 15 to be funded through the Florida Panther Research and 16 Management Trust Fund and the Save the Manatee Trust Fund and review and evaluate projects implemented through the fund. 17 (d) Cooperate with the Department of Education in 18 19 evaluating annual project proposals for projects to be funded 20 through the Florida Panther Research and Management Trust Fund and the Save the Manatee Trust Fund to develop and distribute 21 22 model instructional materials for use in environmental education to integrate environmental education into the 23 24 general curriculum of public school districts, community 25 colleges, and universities. 26 (e) Cooperate with the Department of Environmental 27 Protection in evaluating annual proposals for projects to be 28 funded through the Florida Panther Research and Management 29 Trust Fund and the Save the Manatee Trust Fund that can promote an understanding about environmental protection 30 31 programs and activities administered by the department.

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The Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission shall 1 (7) 2 review the recommended list of projects to be funded from the 3 Florida Panther Research and Management Trust Fund and the 4 Save the Manatee Trust Fund by August of each year and make a 5 final determination of projects to receive grants from б available appropriations by the Legislature. The commission 7 shall act upon the recommended list within 45 days after 8 receipt of the list. 9 Section 4. Subsection (6) of section 372.561, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 10 11 372.561 Issuance of licenses to take wild animal life or freshwater aquatic life; costs; reporting .--12 13 (6)(a) Tax collectors shall remit license and permit 14 moneys, along with a report of funds collected and other required documentation, to the commission within 7 days 15 following the last business day of the week in which the fees 16 were received by the tax collector. The tax collector shall 17 maintain records of all such licenses and permits which are 18 19 sold, and all stamps issued voided, stolen, or lost. The tax 20 collector is responsible to the commission for the fee for all licenses and permits sold and for the value of all universal 21 22 forms or stamps reported as lost. The tax collector shall report stolen permits to the appropriate law enforcement 23 agency. The tax collector shall submit a written report and a 24 copy of the law enforcement agency's report to the commission 25 26 within 5 days after discovering the theft. The value of a 27 universal form or validation stamp is\$25\$5. 28 (b) Tax collectors are also responsible for fees for 29 all licenses and permits sold by their subagents and for the value of all universal forms or stamps reported as lost. 30 The 31 commission may adopt rules to implement this section.

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(c) Not later than August 15 of each year, each county tax collector shall submit to the commission all unissued stamps or universal forms for the previous year along with a written audit report, on forms prescribed or approved by the commission, of the numbers of the unissued stamps or universal forms. Section 5. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. HOUSE SUMMARY Provides for resident and nonresident turkey permits and requires a fee of \$100 for a nonresident permit. Provides that the fee for a permanent hunting and fishing license for a resident 64 years of age or older is \$12. Clarifies language with respect to described licenses, permits, or fees. Reduces to \$55 the fee for a 5-year resident hunting license. Provides that moneys in the Florida Panther Research and Management Trust Fund may be used to fund and administer education programs authorized in s. 372.674, F.S. Provides reference to universal forms with respect to licenses and permits and provides a \$25 fee for the value of a universal form or stamp. bill for details. See
