Subsection (1) of section 457.102, Florida 15 Statutes, is amended to read: 16 457.102 Definitions.--As used in this chapter: "Acupuncture" means a form of primary health care, 17 (1)based on traditional and modern Oriental Chinese medical 18 19 concepts, that employs acupuncture diagnosis and treatment, as 20 well as adjunctive therapies and diagnostic techniques, for the promotion, maintenance, and restoration of health and the 21 22 prevention of disease. Acupuncture shall include, but not be limited to, the insertion of acupuncture needles and the 23 application of moxibustion to specific areas of the human 24 25 body. 26 Section 2. 1 (c) Has successfully completed a board-approved 2 national certification process, is actively licensed in a 3 state that has examination requirements that are substantially equivalent to or more stringent than those of this state, or 4 5 passes an examination administered by the department, which б examination tests the applicant's competency and knowledge of 7 the practice of acupuncture. At the request of any applicant, 8 oriental nomenclature for the points shall be used in the examination. Hold himself or herself out as a certified or 1 (a) 2 licensed acupuncturist unless licensed under this chapter. 3 Practice or attempt to practice acupuncture (b) 4 without an active license or as otherwise provided by this 5 chapter. (c) Obtain or attempt to obtain a license to practice 6 7 acupuncture by fraudulent misrepresentation or present the 8 license of another person as his or her own. 9 Permit an employed person to engage in the (d) 10 practice of acupuncture unless such person holds an active 11 license as an acupuncturist, except as otherwise provided by this chapter. 12 13 (e) Conceal information regarding a violation of this 14 chapter. 15 (f) Use the title "acupuncture," "acupuncturist," or 16 "Oriental medical practitioner," or the letters "L.Ac.," "R.Ac.," "O.M.D.," "A.P.," or "D.O.M.," or any other words, 17 symbols, abbreviations, or insignia indicating that he or she 18 practices acupuncture, unless he or she holds an active 19 20 license under this chapter. 21 Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1 of the year in which enacted. 22 23 24 25 SENATE SUMMARY Redefines the term "acupuncture." Changes the membership of the Board of Acupuncture. Requires an acupuncturist to study Oriental medicine, first aid, and CPR to be licensed. Prohibits certain acts relating to acupuncture. 26 27 28 29 30 31
