Subsections (4) through (8) of section 13 232.246, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as subsections (5) through (9), respectively, subsections (9) and (10) are 14 renumbered and amended, and a new subsection (4) is added to 15 16 said section, to read: 17 232.246 General requirements for high school 18 graduation. --19 (4) High school juniors and seniors who are designated 20 by their principals as qualified to act as tutors for other students in a specific academic area, and who engage in 21 22 tutoring under the supervision of qualified instructional 23 personnel and pursuant to a written agreement between themselves, the school, and each student tutored, shall be 24 awarded one-half credit toward graduation for each semester 25 26 served. Each written agreement entered into under this subsection shall specify the time, place, and manner of 27 28 tutoring. At the end of each semester, each tutor's 29 effectiveness shall be evaluated by his or her supervising instructor. One-fourth additional credit per semester toward 30 graduation may be awarded to any student tutor who is deemed

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30 31 worthy. Any student tutor whose performance is deemed unsatisfactory may be precluded from participating in the tutoring program until such time as, in the judgment of his or her supervising instructor, any deficiencies have been corrected. A supervising instructor need not preclude a student's participation if, in his or her professional judgment, any deficiencies can be corrected while the student tutor continues his or her participation. Any measure of effectiveness used to evaluate student tutors shall include, but not be limited to, measurable academic progress or improvement on behalf of the students tutored.

(10)<del>(9)</del> A student who meets all requirements prescribed in subsections  $(1),(5)\frac{(4)}{(4)}$ , and  $(6)\frac{(5)}{(5)}$  shall be awarded a standard diploma in a form prescribed by the state board. A school board may attach the Florida gold seal vocational endorsement to a standard diploma or, instead of the standard diploma, award differentiated diplomas to those exceeding the prescribed minimums. A student who completes the minimum number of credits and other requirements prescribed by subsections (1) and (5)(4), but who is unable to meet the standards of paragraph(6)(a) $\frac{(5)(a)}{(a)}$ , paragraph(6)(b) $\frac{(5)(b)}{(b)}$ , or  $paragraph(6)(c)\frac{(5)(c)}{(5)}$ , shall be awarded a certificate of completion in a form prescribed by the state board. However, any student who is otherwise entitled to a certificate of completion may elect to remain in the secondary school either as a full-time student or a part-time student for up to 1 additional year and receive special instruction designed to remedy his or her identified deficiencies. This special instruction shall be funded from the state compensatory education funds of the district.
