Section 395.001, Florida Statutes, is 4 amended to read: 5 395.001 Legislative intent.--It is the intent of the 6 Legislature to provide for the protection of public health and 7 safety in the establishment, construction, maintenance, and 8 operation of hospitals, and ambulatory surgical centers, and 9 mobile surgical facilities by providing for licensure of same and for the development, establishment, and enforcement of 10 minimum standards with respect thereto. 11 12 Section 2.
